

Slide Show Requirements

- Create a slide show about Mexican History (in Spanish).
- Use ESR as your starting point. Research one of the topics that interests you (choose a person, region, culture, singular aspect that you can delve into) and then get it approved by Sra. Padilla.
- Slide show will contain at least 10 slides (not including ref. page).
- Slide show should be historically accurate and contain a reference page (please use several references - 3 minimum, excluding ESR).
- Please do not plagiarize and/or translate someone else's original work to Spanish.
- Slide show should be visually interesting (add color, pictures, be creative).
- Slide show should be error free. Spelling and grammar rules will be strictly observed. Be consistent in your writing. (For example, you will more than likely use past tenses when referring to the past, so stick with that unless needed.)
- Slide show should not be book-like or be too text heavy. (It should be interesting.)
- Slide show will be presented in front of the class, so be sure to rehearse, so that you know how to pronounce words and know your topic. You will provide all of the information during your presentation. Be ready to answer questions about your topic.
- Do not read from the text of your slide show.
- You may have note cards while you present, but again, do not read every word!
- Slide show should **not** exceed 5 minutes.
- Due Monday, December 14. Yes, that is before finals. Presentations will begin that day.
