

Un Viaje - Skit

Option #1:

Imagine that you and a friend have planned a great trip to Cancun, Mexico. Your flight was wonderful and you arrive at the airport in Cancun and go directly to the baggage claim area. You wait for an hour and your bags do not show up. You go to the airline customer service center and explain your dilemma.

Role-play a conversation in which you tell an airline representative(s) about your lost bags. The representative(s) should explain what you should do next.

Option #2:

In your group, role-play a scene in which your plane lands in Spain and you go through customs at the airport. The customs official will ask you where you are going, what you are taking with you and when you plan to return. They must inspect your luggage. Include any questions you think a customs official might ask.

Option #3:

Imagine you arrive late at the airport for your trip to Chile. You are so flustered that you packed your bags too heavily and you lose your ticket and/or passport. Once you work things out, your flight attendant is rude and/or inept and it's your pilot's first day flying a commercial airliner (you will survive to tell this tale, please). Role-play the scenes.
